^{*}Students must demonstrate that they have covered the content in all courses in the program, however, students who have completed coursework in a graduate or undergraduate program may waive comparable courses in their Mason licensure certificate program down to a minimum of 15 credits.

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¹ EDSE 791 should be taken with the 4th or 5th course in your program. On the non-cohort schedule EDSE 791 is offered in spring and fall, but is not always offered in summer. Please plan your schedule accordingly and register early to ensure you are able to take EDSE 791 with your 4th or 5th course.

² EDSE 792 should be taken with the last course in your program. It is offered every semester, but please register early to ensure you are able to take the course in the semester that you need it (cohort students can disregard).

³ EDSE 790 Internship: Two internship experiences are required for licensure certificate programs: one at the elementary level and one at the secondary level. Students must have passing Praxis I, VCLA and VRA scores on file before starting an internship.

INTERNSHIP APPLICATIONS DEADLINES ARE:

- Fall and Summer: Due to advisor by February 1
- Fall On-the-Job: Due to advisor by April 15
- Summer On-the-Job: Due to advisor by April 15
- Spring: Due to advisor by September 1
- Spring On-the-Job: Due to advisor by November 15

Late applications will not be accepted.

- ❖ Some students are eligible to waive one internship experience. (See http://cehd.gmu.edu/teacher/intpract/ for more information on the requirements for the waiver and the documentation that a student must submit in order to request the waiver.)
 - Students who are teaching may complete one internship on the job and request a waiver of the off level internship (e.g. a secondary teacher may complete an on the job internship at the secondary level and request a waiver for the elementary internship.)
 - Waiving an internship affects the number of credits that a student will have to apply to a certificate program since waiving the course means that 2 credits that the student would normally complete will no longer be applied to their certificate. If you unsure if will be able to meet the 15 credit minimum for the certificate, please discuss your options with an advisor (Jancy Templeton, itemple1@gmu.edu, 703-993-2387) before deciding whether or not to pursue the waiver option.
